


CTD'S MISSION

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BUDGET- CARE ATTENDANTS





- Increase the base wage to \$10.50 in 2018 and \$13.00 in 2019
 - Cost is \$1.25B in General Revenue (GR)

BUDGET - PROMOTING INDEPENDENCE



- 500 (HCS) slots for residents of SSLCs and large ICFs/IID
 - 400 slots for SSLCs

3,146 Additional

• 100 slots for large and medium ICF/IIDs

Community Living Placements

- 236 HCS slots for children aging out of foster care
- 400 HCS crisis slots for persons at imminent risk of institutionalization
- 120 HCS slots for the movement of individuals with IDD from state hospitals
- 40 HCS slots for DFPS children transitioning from residence operations facilities
- 700 slots for individuals with IDD moving from nursing facilities (NFs)
- 600 HCS slots for individuals with IDD diverted from nursing facility placement
- **550** Medically Dependent Children (MDCP) slots for nursing facility diversion

BUDGET - PROMOTING INDEPENDENCE



Community Living Placements

- HHSC Exceptional Item #14 for 3,146 community waiver slots for people moving out of institutions or at imminent risk of institutionalization - \$50.1M
- Require HHSC to report any offset of money saved from high-cost institutions diversion



BUDGET - RELOCATION CONTRACTS



Community Based Organizations

- Restore overlooked HHSC budget item for Transition to Community Living Supports – \$5M
- Require HHSC to report any offset of money saved from high-cost institutions diversion





BUDGET - EARLY CHILDHOOD INTERVENTION



HHSC Exceptional Item #6 –
maintain current caseloads
 (\$41.9 million GR/ \$44.8 million AF)



BUDGET – COMMUNITY SERVICES



Full restoration of the following programs:

- Lifespan Respite for family caregivers
- In-Home and Family Support for flexible needs
- Recovery-based Clubhouse model for mental health peer services

All of these are low-cost and proven effective

 Funding for the Office of Court Administration's guardianship monitoring to protect rights

CHILDREN - RIDER 50



Medicaid Therapy Cuts

- Restore reimbursement rate cuts made by Rider 50
- Maintain restored rate and increase reimbursement rate
 - Ensure access to therapies





CHILDREN - CPS & MENTAL HEALTH



Child Protective Services

- Decrease CPS staff caseloads
- Address foster care management system

Mental Health

- Refocus efforts for mental health services including:
 - trauma informed care
 - transition services from primary education into higher education or vocational options



CHILDREN - EARLY CHILDHOOD INTERVENTION



HHSC Exceptional Item #6 - maintain current caseloads -

(\$41.9 million GR/ \$44.8 million AF)

Additional efforts:

- Expand eligibility to pre-2012 levels
- Increase funding to serve more eligible children
- Streamline or eliminate administrative burden for contractors
 - Provide additional dedicated funds for providers' staff:
 - "Child Find"
 - Transition coordination for pre-kindergarten



CHILDREN – SPECIAL EDUCATION



- Eliminate the 8.5% performance indicator
- Restore services and supports to children with disabilities
- Provide school districts with guidance and the resources to address the current systemic failures
- Implement meaningful stakeholder involvement at TEA,
 Independent School Districts, and individual school campuses

TRANSPORTATION - ACCESSIBLE PARKING



Strengthen accessible parking enforcement, increase public education, and limit placard abuse

- Limit access of overly abused secondary placards
- Discuss the overuse of placards for free meter parking by those without disabilities
- Expand existing volunteer enforcement programs
- Streamline filing of citations
 - more efficient, accessible, and error free
- Increase Judges' flexibility
 - Education program versus paying a full or modified fine



TRANSPORTATION - TNC'S



Transportation Network Companies

- Include accessibility in any legislation pertaining to TNCs
- Include stakeholder input
- Adhere to CTD's "Principles of Accessibility" in Vehiclesfor-Hire (TXDisabilities.org/transportation)

Employment 1st and Historically Underutilized Businesses

- Support the Employment 1st Task Force recommendations
 - Recommend including entrepreneurs with disabilities in HUB (historically underutilized business) eligibility





HEALTHCARE ACCESS – PRESCRIPTION DRUGS



 Support greater access to a full range of therapeutic options including:



- Strengthen patient protections and transparency in both commercial and Medicaid programs
- Limit barriers to access
 - over utilization of prior authorizations
 - step therapies
- Improve patient medication adherence
 - prescription drug synchronization
